## **Congratulations to Olympia Middle School!**

Olympia School District joined Promise Council last year and its Middle School was recently redesignated as a *Horizon School to Watch*.

According to the Pantagraph (April 14, 2022) the school originally received this designation in 2018, based on an innovative mentoring program that pairs new and experienced educators, a new and improved math curriculum and a standards-based grading system. The re-designation looks for ways the school has grown, and one important focus for OMS has been social emotional learning for students.



Laura O'Donnell, School Superintendent, said "The Olympia Middle School staff has always been extremely collaborative and forward thinking. They understand the social, emotional AND academic needs of middle school students and have created structures and systems to support their students.
