(APC) Community Center on Saturday, December 17. Teenagers are welcome to help out as well. If you are interested in helping, please click on the Sign-up Genius link here.


Fox Creek Elementary

Donations and volunteer hours completed by retirees in 2023 or later will not be eligible.

Today is the first day of December! As we anticipate all we might accomplish before Father Time puts 2022 in the rearview mirror, the board also wanted to take a moment to review the work it has done in support of its 23 schools this calendar year. Since January 1, 2022, the board and its many committee volunteers are proud to share its accomplishments.

- 1. Through its work with Jaclyn Byers, Executive on Loan from State Farm, the board:
- a. updated its mission, vision and logo
- b. completed its first strategic planning exercise, establishing goals and key performance indicators for the coming year
- c. Reorganized and revitalized its committee structure
- 2. Working closely with our school leadership teams and community partners, we:
- a. Developed the Purple Redbirds Tutoring Program at BHS
- b. Supported several new matches through the Big Brothers Big Sisters Mentoring Program
- c. Conducted 14 very successful 100 Caring Adults events to welcome students back to school
- d. Provided financial support to the BHS Student Activism Fund
- 3. Our committees were hard at work:
- a. Writing grants, requesting
- i. \$20,000 from the John M Scott Foundation to support student health care

needs. News of our success will come in January, 2023.

- ii. \$10,000 for a Women To Women Grant to support mentoring and tutoring programs. Note: We have been notified that we are a finalist for this grant, and will learn of our success in January, 2023.
- b. Recruiting new board members; Erin Duncan joined us in August, 2022, and we are currently talking two additional potential members stay tuned for more news!
- c. Raising funds Over \$16,000 in individual and corporate donations were either directly from or inspired by board members
- d. Discussing and developing new web-based content to keep our website relevant and useful to our schools, community partners, and the public
- 4. Joining the Chamber of Commerce, exponentially increasing our potential new contacts for volunteerism and funds
- 5. Attending Nonprofit Fairs sponsored by State Farm and the Chamber of Commerce

The Promise Council Board of Directors considers it an honor to do this work on behalf of our schools and the children who attend them. We remain committed to *helping schools help kids* for the remainder of this year and in the new year to come.
