






# "Opening Doors" for 5th Grade Students

As part of the "Opening Doors" program sponsored by Promise Council, 5th graders from Pepper Ridge visited State Farm's b'link facility on Tuesday, April 18th. The Opening Doors program was created to help fifth grade students envision their futures in ways they may not have considered. The possibilities of attaining a higher education, potential careers, and vocational skills are introduced. "Social and Emotional Learning Competencies" are also discussed to provide students with real tools to be their best self.

While at b'link the more than 50 students were split into 3 different rotations to hear more about State Farm and how they work with communities across the nation, including Bloomington/Normal and all of McLean County. They also heard from STEM volunteers about technology and related careers that help all of us achieve more. Finally they were provided the opportunity to give back and help others as they assembled hygiene kits to be used by other Promise Council schools.

It was a great morning of listening to what was on their minds and answering a host of

questions about State Farm, the STEM program, and opportunities for them to give of their time to help others.
